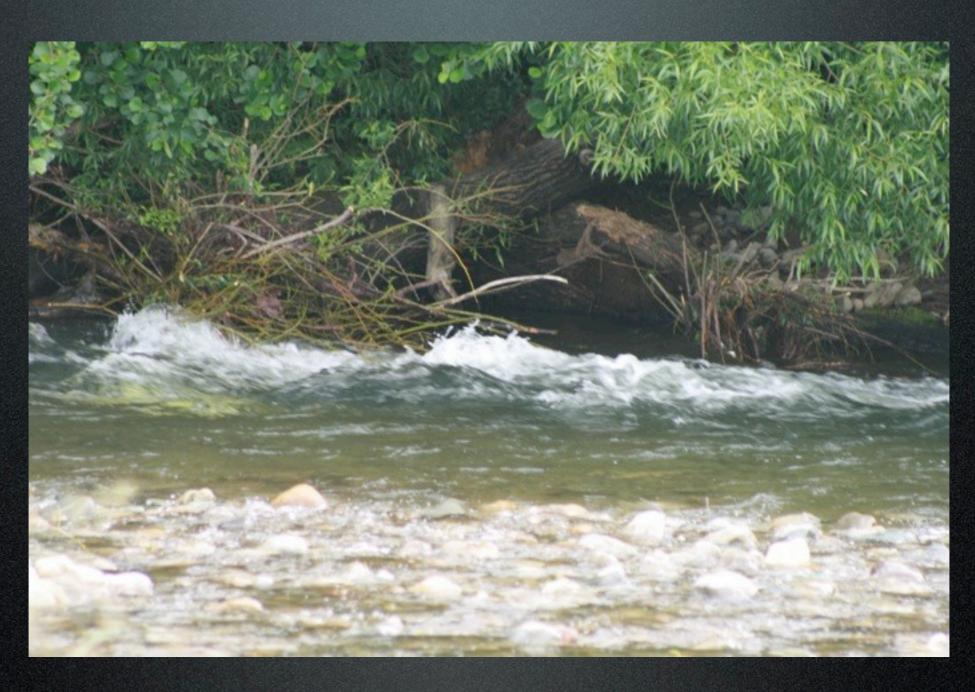






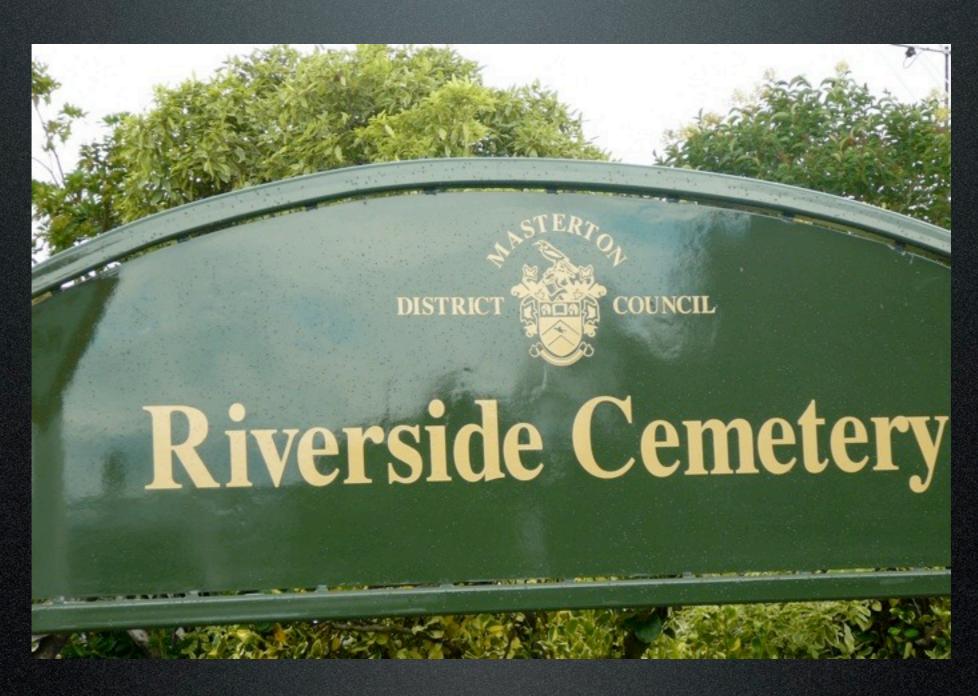


Our River
